

Oil Rig Owl Rescue

An owl, rescued from a North Sea oil rig. has been released back into the wild. The female short-eared owl was found on the Noble Patriot platform, which is 180 miles (290km) from Shetland. It is thought that the owl was migrating from Scandinavia, when stormy weather blew her off course and she was forced to land on the rig. When offshore worker, Sam Crowe, saw her, he knew that she would not be able to find her own food. He said, 'Knowing it wasn't going to survive out here, I made it a little home

in a box and got it some raw chicken and some water. The rescue team came and picked it up, and then it got released. A very good ending to the story. It's a little superstar is that owl.' After a couple of days, the bird was transported by helicopter to Sumburgh Airport and then to Hillswick Wildlife Sanctuary. She was examined by vet nurse, Lisa Trueman, and found to be in good health but underweight. The owl was then cared for and fed well at Shetland's only wildlife sanctuary, before being released back into the wild.

Happiest Cities

The 20 happiest cities in the world have been announced for 2025. Abu Dhabi, UAE, was top of the list. Second place went to Medellín in Colombia. Cape Town, in South Africa was third. Glasgow, in the UK, has also been ranked among the happiest cities in the world, coming in at number 20! The giant survey, conducted by Time Out, questioned 18,000 people about the city they live in and how happy it makes them feel. The happiest cities were measured by working out the percentage of people who responded positively to these five statements:

- My city makes me happy.
- I feel happier in my city than other places I've visited or lived.
- The people in my city seem happy.

- I find joy in the everyday experiences my city offers.
- The sense of happiness in my city has grown a lot recently.

99 percent of locals from the Emirati capital agreed that their city makes them happy. 96 percent answered that people in their city seem positive, and 93 percent said that they feel happier in their city than anywhere else.
